

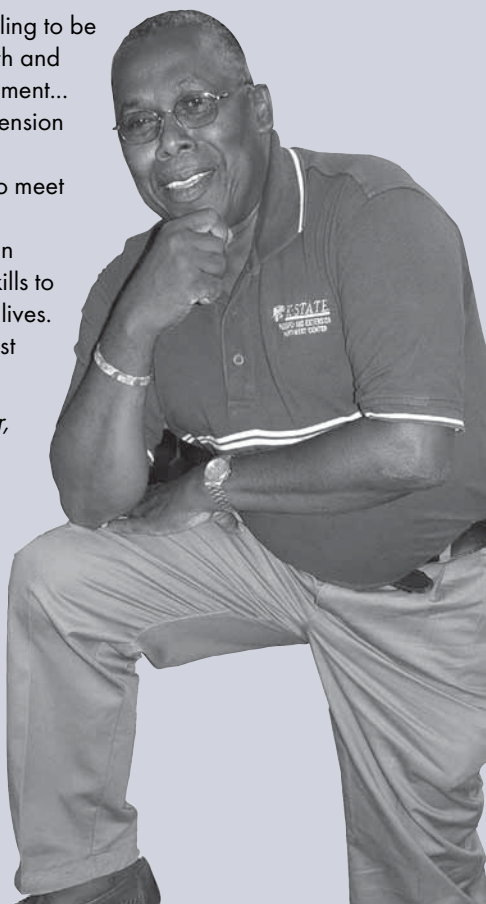
K-State Research and Extension needs women and men of all backgrounds who enjoy helping others learn and develop, and who work well with a minimum of supervision.

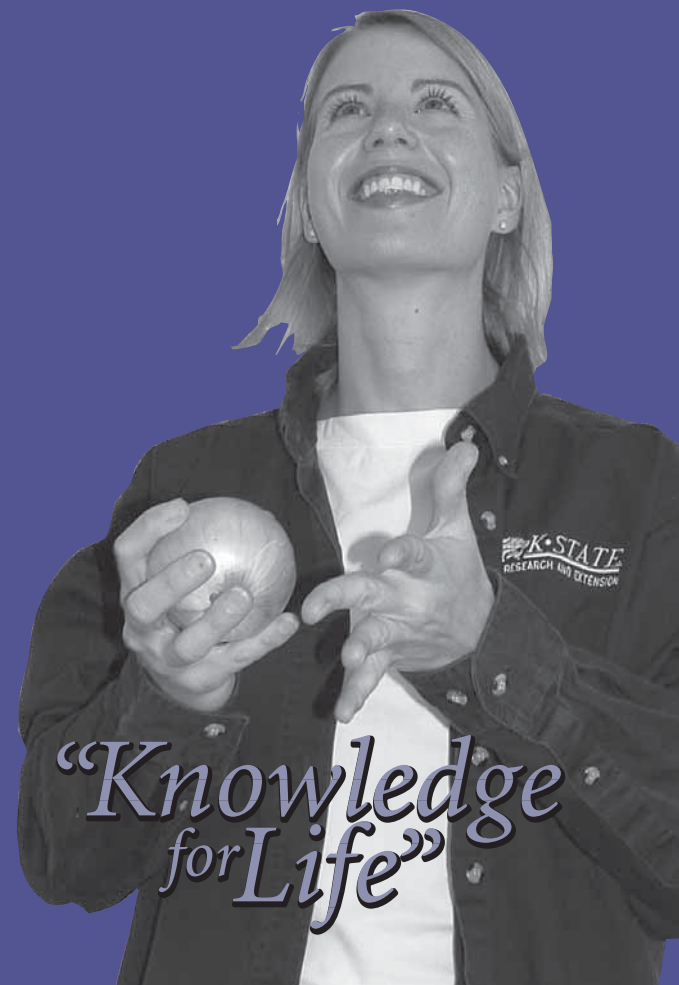

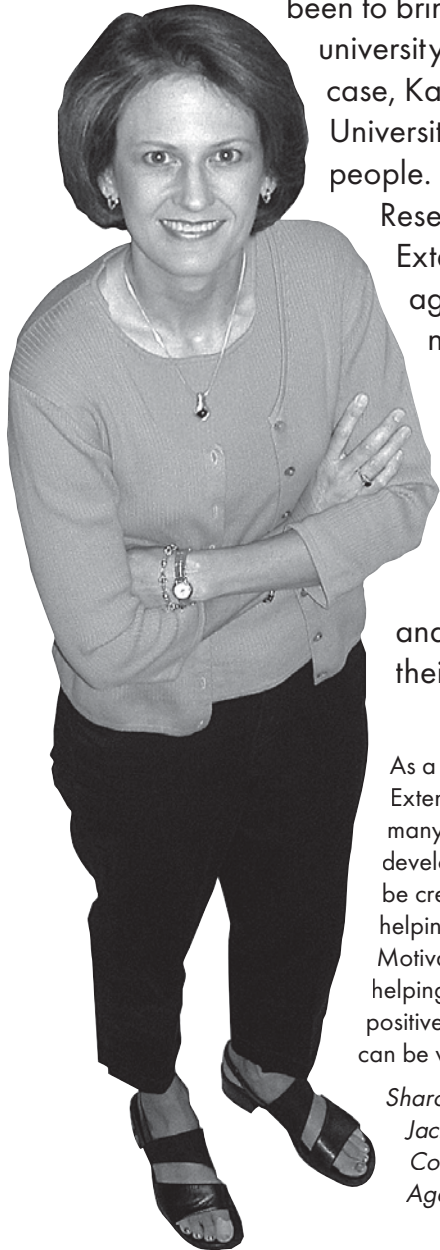
