A Guide to Low-Cost Curricula and Resources for Marriage and Relationship, Fatherhood and Parenting, and Financial Education¹

Are you looking for low-cost or free curricula to support efforts to strengthen relationships for singles, couples, parents or families? This guide will help you find Web-based and other resources including materials developed with federal funding that are available for public distribution. It is the second in a series of guides designed by Administration for Children and Families' (ACF) Healthy Marriage Initiative staff to support the implementation of valuable programs under the Healthy Marriage and Responsible Fatherhood Initiatives.

The guide offers an alphabetized list of curricula and resources in three areas: (1) Marriage and Relationship, (2) Fatherhood and Parenting, and (3) Financial Education. Although this is not an exhaustive compilation, we have included materials about financial literacy because many organizations have indicated a need for this type of information. "Curricula" refers to an organized set of ideas and activities that seek to meet specific learning objectives. These may include instructional booklets, lesson plans, discussion guides or an outline of topics and activities developed specifically for an educational activity. "Resources" are defined more broadly and include handouts, tip sheets and other supplementary materials for program implementation, marketing or general knowledge. The basic criterion for including a listing in the guide is based on whether the cost of instructor manual or teaching resource is \$250 or less. Many materials are free. Each listing includes the names of the author(s) or curriculum developers, a short description, contact information and cost.

In the introduction to the ACF Marriage Education Curriculum Guide (2007, available at http://www.acf.hhs.gov/healthymarriage/doc/ACF_Curriculum_Assessment_Guide.doc), we noted one of the most important decisions to be made is the choice of curriculum. There is a wide variety of marriage education curricula designed to educate different types of audiences or designed for specific delivery contexts or approaches. We realize that curriculum selection is a time-consuming process that can entail a significant financial investment by an organization for the purchase of materials and staff training. Whether you must rely totally on free or low-cost materials, wish to augment your offerings or want to gain some experience delivering marriage education services before making a major outlay of human or monetary resources, we encourage you to make informed choices. Once you identify potentially useful marriage education materials, we recommend that you use the ACF Marriage Education Curriculum Assessment Guide as part of your review and comparison process.

There are legal issues to consider when using materials developed by others. You should always respect the author's copyright. The fact that a grantee or organization has a copyright on materials means that the organization has the exclusive right to reproduce, sell, or otherwise distribute the materials. Therefore, the organization could require that others who wish to sell, reproduce, or otherwise

distribute the materials must compensate the organization that has the copyright to the materials. There are several complex exceptions to these rules which include circumstances under which others may use the materials without violating the copyright. Sometimes, the copyright laws permit limited use by another party. Furthermore, material that appears to be available for free use often indicates that you need to obtain the author's permission to use it. When in doubt, consult with the author or publisher.

If you are considering using materials that have been produced as part of a government grant, remember the grantee maintains a copyright on curricula and other materials it produces with federal funds. However, despite this fact, when material has been produced using ACF funding, ACF has a right to distribute and use the work for legitimate government purposes.

Even when others' materials are available for your free use, it is expected that you will properly credit the author's work. After all, give credit where credit is due; the author invested time, energy and intellectual effort to produce a useful product!

Thank you for your interest and your willingness to provide marriage, relationship and fatherhood education to the individuals and couples you serve. Since new materials are continually being developed, please share what you find, so that it can be shared with others. Promoting Child Welfare: Training Professionals to Support Healthy Marriages, Relationships and Families

The following five curricula were developed through the Administration for Children and Families (ACF) Children's Bureau (CB) five-year grant program entitled, Promoting Child Welfare: Training Professionals to Support Healthy Marriages, Relationships, and Families. The purpose of these grants was to develop curricula and programs to train students and/or professionals about relationship and marriage education who are working in agencies providing services to families at risk of or receiving services related to the abuse and neglect of children.

Building Couple Teams

Developed by the University of Louisville Kent School of Social Work for child welfare professionals and social work students and funded by the Administration for Children and Families. Provides specific training strategies for staff to help couples maintain low-conflict, caring relationships. Instructor manuals include: (1) Why marriage matters to child welfare, (2) Couple skills and communication, (3) Diverse family configurations-divorced, blended families and dating couples, (4) Couple issues in foster care and adoption, (5) Domestic violence, and (6) Couple case work skills. Additional online modules include: how to reach culturally diverse couples or those with mental health, substance abuse or domestic violence issues.
